Hatchet Pond Walk

Unfortunately our planned walk at Kimmeridge was cancelled. Mike and Liz stepped into the breach and arranged a circular walk around Hatchet Pond in the New Forest. It is reached on the B3055 from Brockenhurst at the junction with the B3054 Lymington Road, near Beaulieu. Managed by Forestry England, it is the New Forest's largest body of freshwater and home to some of the rarest wetland plants and freshwater animals. As such it has the highest conservation status as both a Site of Special Scientific Interest and a Special Area for Conservation. A major restoration plan has been put in place, with changes made to protect the pond for future generations. The toilets have been removed to reduce the risk of pollution along with no swimming or dogs allowed into the water. Our quest was to find Hampshire Purslane only found in the New Forest, which was successful. We also found Lesser Bladderwort and Unbranched Burweed both rare plants of the New Forest along with our first sighting of Autumn Lady's Tresses.
