Hosted Woodland Walk

Mike and Liz kindly arranged a hosted walk with Barry Deaken. A few years ago Barry purchased 6 acres of mixed woodland and has been carrying out management work including coppicing to encourage wildlife there ever since. He invited us on a tour of his woodland beginning with a talk about his work over a cup of coffee at his shelter, built by himself using his own wood. Afterwards he gave us a guided walk around his lovely woodland to the lower damper side where there were restored ponds to aid drainage. He has deer and foxes visiting and badger sets on site who have produced youngsters in previous years, the badgers had found a Buff-tailed Bumblebee nest in the ground which they had recently dug out to obtain food. Around the site there are several corrugated steel sheets with lots of reptiles in residence underneath. After lunch we went on a second walk to the higher side of the wood where Barry also showed us his charcoal burner and explained how it worked, he had just carried out a burn which was cooling down ready for the charcoal to be bagged up and sold on.
