Spetisbury Walk

Date:9th August 2022Weather:Sunny and hot, 30 degreesWalk Leaders:Rosemary and Derek RobertsAttendees:8 on long walk plus 3 on short walk

With the continuing heatwave eight hardy members had a delightful walk starting from Spetisbury village car park. Spetisbury is a village and civil parish in north Dorset, situated on the River Stour and the A350 road, four miles southeast of Blandford Forum. We crossed the main road to follow the footpath over a long, raised metal footbridge which passes over the Mill House garden, then walking alongside the Mill House, over the weir to follow the path and emerge through a small iron gate into the open water meadow, passing by Keyneston Mill House. Reaching a minor road which we crossed over to follow the tarmac track, with Tarrant Abbey House on the right along with the dried up River Tarrant, to reach St Mary The Virgin Church at Tarrant Crawford. The site is close to the spot where the 12th century Cistercian nunnery of Tarrant stood before it was destroyed in the Reformation. The neighbouring farm is still named Tarrant Abbey, and possesses an ancient medieval barn that may have been an abbey building. We followed the path to the right of the church through a field and crossed the minor road again, we followed the footpath across fields to cross the lovely Crawford Bridge over the River Stour dated 1719, to bring us back to the A350. Crossing over this road and walking ahead we reached the trailway, a section of the same trailway we walked on the Fiddleford walk. Opened in 1863 the old Somerset and Dorset railway ran steam-hauled trains between Bournemouth and Bath. Sections of the old railway line are now used as a walking, cycling and horse riding route. It took us back to the disused Spetisbury railway station and our cars.
